You will learn how the brain can modulate the activity of all organs and tissues and also how brain functions are conditioned by the relative state of health of the rest of the body. Presentations will draw the attendee's attention to these aspects, including how to face up to brain damage, the best and most up-to-date management strategies for neonatal diseases, reporting new guidelines and new strategies for prevention.
